

QR CODE Check-in, Face Mask, PCR Test & Job Exemption

PRIVACY ACT 1988 - SECTION 94H

The check-in app is voluntary. A person commits an offence if the person requires another person to upload COVID app data without consent, or refuses participation in an activity, entry to premises otherwise accessible to the public, or receipt of goods or services. Penalties apply.

If anyone attempts to intimidate or coerce you to partake in a PCR test, wear a mask, take a job or enforce lockdowns and isolations, they must show a HUMAN BIOSECURITY CONTROL ORDER issued by a biosecurity officer.
